Timeline of Folger Estate Land

First inhabited by Costanoan Indians

1769 – Portola expedition camped in the valley.

1840 – Canada de Raymundo Rancho granted to John Copinger by Governor Alvarado.

1846 – 2,280 acres of timbered slopes and valley range purchased by Charles Brown.

1872 – Simon Jones became owner of 1,500 acres of the western portion. Utilizing Chinese labor, the property was cleared and became Hazel Wood Farm.

1902 – James A. Folger II (CATC's founding president) acquired the property as a warm country getaway from San Francisco's cold summers. Folger developed the first hydro electrical system in California.

1956 – Martin Wunderlich purchased the Folger estate.

1974 – 942 acres deeded by Martin Wunderlich to San Mateo County for use as Wunderlich Park and open space.

2004 – Folger Estate Stable Historic District named to the National Register of Historic Places.

2010 – The Folger Stable and surrounding buildings opened to the public.

The Folger estate was the first of famed architect Arthur Brown Jr's works. Brown was a protégés of Bay Area architect Bernard Maybeck. Among Brown's later commissions were the interior of the City of Paris department store, Berkeley and San Francisco's city halls, SF's War Memorial Opera House and Veteran's Building, and Coit Tower.
