Avenues. Parking is free. If the lot is full, park along one of the streets, but check the  
signs, as some areas are restricted.

**DIRECTIONS:** From I-5, take the Sutterville Road exit. Turn onto Riverside Blvd. going  
north and proceed north until you come to 12<sup>th</sup> Ave. Turn right into the park on 12<sup>th</sup> Ave.;  
then turn right on Cavanaugh Way (one-way) to reach the restrooms and parking area.  
Leashes required; please, no flexis. Bring poop bags, and water for yourself and your

## ***Who was William Land?***

William Land was a founding father of Sacramento.

He was born in Herkimer, NY, in 1836.

Land's father sold his son (nice guy!) into indentured servitude to a local farmer for a payment of \$50 per year. William worked off the agreement, attended Iron City Commercial College, Penn. (oldest business school in US), and graduated with honors. Henry J. Heinz later attended the same school!

Land ventured west arriving in San Francisco in 1860.

With only \$3 in his pocket, Land **walked** from SF to Sacramento to save the transport cost.

Realizing the potential for growth in the young California capital, Land invested heavily in the area.

Land was proprietor of The Western Hotel on 2<sup>nd</sup>/K Streets, one of the largest hotels on the coast. In 1875 lodging cost \$1-2.

The mayor of Sacramento from 1898-1899 was William Land.

William Land owned an Airedale named Herkimer--just kidding!

Land was a founder of the East Lawn Memorial Cemetery, his final resting place.

When Land died in 1911 he gave a quarter of a million dollars to develop a public park in his beloved city.
