DID YOU KNOW?

The town of Davisville shortened its name to Davis in 1907.

UC Davis opened its doors in 1908 as the "University Farm", the location of research and science based instruction for UC Berkeley.

The "University Farm" was renamed the Northern Branch of the College of Agriculture in 1922.

UC Davis is a land grant university. (In 1862, states were given public lands to establish colleges to teach agriculture and the mechanical arts. These land grant colleges helped extend higher education to broad segments of the U.S. population.)

UCD students and sports teams are lovingly referred to as "Aggies."

By 1959, UCD had grown into a general campus of the University of California.

UC Davis has the third-largest enrollment in the UC system after UCLA and Berkeley.

The University of California, Davis, is the only university west of the Rockies to grant degrees from the schools of law, medicine, and veterinary medicine.

The Department of Viticulture and Enology (grape growing and wine making) helps the California wine industry continue its excellence.

The current UC Davis West Village complex includes the first community college on a UC campus.

In 2016, UC Davis was named the "most sustainable university in the world". Famous alumni include CATC members Kristi Burrus and Chris Hyde. Go Aggies!
